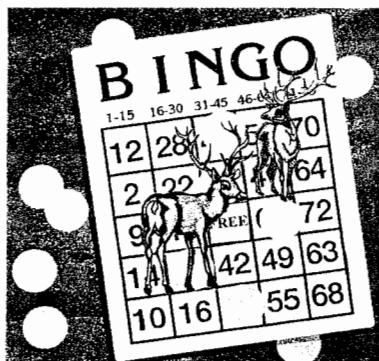

HOUSE RULES

1. No one except the bartender(s) on duty, the Exalted Ruler and members of the house committee will be permitted behind the bar.
2. Profane or obscene language or conduct will not be tolerated. Persons transgressing this rule shall be asked to leave the Lounge and the Club Manager shall make a complete report of the incident to the house committee.
3. The Club Manager and Bartenders shall refuse service to anyone they feel is intoxicated and shall make every effort to see those people go home safely.
4. Checks not to exceed 50. May be cashed by members in good standing with this Lodge at the discretion of the Club Manager or bartenders. The member's name address, telephone and membership number must appear on the check. If a check is returned to the Lodge for any reason the member will have 14 days to reimburse the Lodge and also will lose all check cashing privileges.
5. The lounge shall be for the enjoyment of the members and their guests only. The bartenders on duty shall require proof of the member and to all persons not known to him or her to be members of the order.
6. Members will be held strictly responsible for the conduct of their guest, and at any club activity said guests must be seated with the members responsible and must leave with said member.
7. Club Room will be closed during all formal services recognized by the Lodge Officers.
8. The lounge will be closed on all meeting nights when the Tiler informs the Club Manager that the meeting is about to begin. No alcoholic beverages shall be served thereafter until the meeting is closed.
9. Request for the use of the Lodge rooms and/or parts of the House shall first be cleared with the Trustees. Other committees being in charge of events taking place in the Lodge shall take no action that will interfere with the powers of the house committee or Club Manager without first obtaining approval of the same.
10. All persons entering the building shall be clothed in a discreet manner. No tank tops after 6 PM.
11. Unescorted Ladies will be permitted in the lounge only upon presentation of "Ladies Card" which can be obtained by members for their wives from the Secretary.
12. Bar and Lounge hours are to be posted and may not be altered except by vote of the house committee. The bar is not to be operated unless an authorized bartender or house committee member is on duty.
13. No one under the age of 16 shall be allowed to play on the pool table unless supervised by an adult.
14. No minors allowed at the bar at any time. No one under the age of 18 years old allowed in the social club after 11 PM unless invited for special occasions.
15. Violations of these rules shall be reviewed by the house committee. The house committee upon hearing all factors in the case shall make recommendations for final disposition. At no time shall the house committee operate outside Grand lodge Statutes or Lodge by Laws which may apply in a disciplinary action.
16. No sandals will be permitted in social quarter or dining area after 7:00 PM.
17. Appropriate uniforms will be worn by all lounge employees. There will be three tops initially provided by Hollywood West Lodge #2365 to be worn with their own personal black pants or slacks.
18. All other rules which the house committee deems necessary will be added or changed after 30 days notification to the members of Hollywood West Lodge #2365 and compliance with Grand Lodge Statute Sec. 17.060.
19. No smoking allowed in the Lodge hall during lodge functions

HALL RENTAL

On December 14, the Lodge Trustees voted to implement the first hike in the Hall rental rates in 5 years.

This increase was necessitated by the escalation of utility fees experienced over that period. The revised schedule is as follows:

Non-Member Hall Rental	\$500	4 hour window
Member Private party	\$400	4 hour window
Member Open Party	\$150	4 hour window
Extra Time	\$100	per hour
Broward Transit Tax	6%	All the above subject to tax
Cleanup	\$50	Tenant responsible for returning hall to original condition. Fee for mopping and vacuuming
Bartender	\$45	4 hour window
Extra Time	\$10	per hour
Kitchen	\$100	Or as negotiated depending on use. A \$100 deposit will be held until 24 hours after the function to allow proper inspection.
Drinks		Drinks will be charged at the same price as members pay at the bar
