This is by far the most difficult message I have written. There are distinct reasons for this. First, I share this message, on this page with a man whom I owe most of the reason for my involvement with our organization. Yes, it was Art who got me started and taught me early on, as an Elk, the ways of Elkdom. As a teacher he was born with a gift to be able to express himself and be understood at every level of education. Secondly, this is the last time I will be able to address our membership as your Exalted Ruler. This is an honor I will always cherish.

How do I accomplish this last task? Besides just saying thank you to the many people who assisted me with the work we accomplished this past year. I think I will share with you what the man we honor on my final address taught me.

Art taught me that the Elks were a 501(C)(8) organization. I did not understand the difference between a 501 (C) and a 501 (C)(8) organization and asked for an explanation. He explained the creation of our organization, its legality goes back to an act of Congress, as far back as 1896. It was Congress that defined what a "fraternal benevolent society" was. I asked what it meant to him. He explained it as an organization whose members have embraced a vocation of common calling in a fraternal setting, thus establishing Brotherly Love. An organization where doctors, lawyers, professionals and common people all are entitled to similar benefits, exemplifying Justice. An organization which will provide assistance to the sick and disabled and aid those families of a deceased member exemplifying Charity. Constantly focusing on improving conditions, creating bonds, being ever vigilant and being able to cross boundaries demographically by creating an atmosphere governed from a hierarchy, to individual lodges. It all started making sense to me.

Thank you, Art. Thank you Elks of Lodge 2365.


